



**THE FRIDAY NIGHT FEEL-GOOD MOVIES!!

Based on a true story, the movie tells of a struggling British shoe factory's young, strait-laced owner, Charlie, who forms an unlikely partnership with Lola, a drag queen, to save the business. Charlie develops a plan to produce custom footwear for drag queens, rather than the men's dress shoes that his firm is known for, and in the process, he and Lola discover that they are not so different after all. After the Dashwoods move to a cottage in Devonshire, Elinor's sister Marianne (Kate Winslet) is torn between the handsome John Willoughby (Greg Wise) and the older Colonel Brandon (Alan Rickman). Meanwhile, Elinor's romantic hopes with Edward Ferrars (Hugh Grant) are hindered due to his prior engagement. Both Elinor and Marianne strive for love while the circumstances in their lives constantly change. A charming Jane Austen movie!</p>

Arvilla (Jessica Lange)'s husband Joe died during a trip to Borneo. Though Joe had previously specified in his will that he would like his ashes scattered by his beloved wife, Arvilla soon becomes locked in a heated battle of wills with Joe's daughter Francine, and as Joe's will is missing, she agrees to surrender the ashes to her. Two of Arvilla's friends (Kathy Bates and Joan Allen) agree to join her and the trio set out in Arvilla's vintage '66 Pontiac Bonneville for a journey of a lifetime.</p>

He finds a glimmer of hope in the mysterious, über-cool and beautiful Raphina, and invites her to star in his band's music videos. There's only one problem: he's not part of a band...yet. She agrees, and Conor, under pressure, forms a band with a few lads. Sing Street shows us how music has the power to transform us into something greater.</p>

When Robin is struck down by polio at the age of 28, he is confined to a hospital bed and given only a few months to live. With the help of Diana's twin brother (Tom Hollander) and the groundbreaking ideas of inventor Teddy Hall (Hugh Bonneville), Robin and Diana dare to escape the hospital ward to seek out a full and passionate life together - raising their young son, traveling and devoting their lives to helping other polio patients. **BREATHE** is a heartwarming celebration of love and human possibility.

The Big Sick 2017 is based on the real-life courtship between Kumail Nanjiani and Emily V. Gordon and tells the story of Pakistan-born aspiring comedian Kumail (Nanjiani), who connects with grad student Emily (Kazan) after one of his standup sets. Their one-night stand blossoms into the real thing, which complicates the life that is expected of Kumail by his traditional Muslim parents. When Emily is beset with a mystery illness, it forces Kumail to navigate the medical crisis with her parents, Beth and Terry (Holly Hunter and Ray Romano) who he's never met, while dealing with the emotional tug-of-war between his family and his heart.
